— purpose is to prompt creative thoughts, or "unblock" artists when inspiration is lacking.


 roll each individually or in combination depending on your situation/question.

- prompting creative thought leads to great ideas.
 - helps analytical thinkers --> creative thinking.
 - formal creative process --> practice makes perfect.
 - great ideas --> great rewards.
- multi-purpose and durable:
 - children can play and learn with them too.
 - age-, gender-, location- neutral.
 - pass on as antiques from this generation to the next.
 - throw them. build with them. use as magic 8-ball.
 - stress relief.
- it may be a fun toy, but it's actually useful.

 great design ideas are often economically beneficial for all parties (and the future).

— win-win: designer is successful, client is successful.

- product is easy to produce = cheap to produce, more profit.

easily accessible materials = worldwide availability.

— sustainable materials = long term viability.

— minimal assembly = cheap/clean manufacturing.

- easy to substitute materials and/or production methods and still produce the same product.

— square shapes = no waste of materials or transport.

— many spin-offs and expansion packs can be produced.

— possible to DIY = free to DIY, possible to customize.

— if children can learn to be creative also, then that's an investment in our future.

ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFIT?

- wood from sustainable sources is sustainable.
- whole wood blocks = no off-gassing, recyclable.
- minimal fabrication = not harmful to manufacturers or environment.
- minimal packaging:
 - chipboard
 - chipboard is paper-pulp based, not plastic.
 - biodegradable
 - duralar
 - duralar decomposes faster than acetate.
 - very thin, 0.004" thickness.
 - square shapes = no waste of materials or transport.
- multi-purpose and re-usable in a number of ways.

A formal method for creative thought. An *idea-generator*.

Digital or physical?

Physical allows interaction/ specialized/ easy to reach for/ personal choice of how to use the product. I need to make a *fun* idea generator that graphic designers will use when they need inspiration, or have an *artistic block*. So how do I randomize choices in a physical device? A game. Dice.
